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INTERIM MANAGEMENT REPORT OF FUND PERFORMANCE

The management report of fund performance presents the views of the portfolio management team concerning significant factors and developments that have affected the Fund's performance and outlook.

Redwood Asset Management Inc. ("Redwood") was amalgamated into Purpose Investments Inc. ("Purpose"). The Fund changed its name to Purpose Canadian Preferred Share Fund effective May 2, 2018.

INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES AND STRATEGIES

The investment objective of the Fund is principally to provide a consistent stream of income with potential for capital appreciation by investing in Canadian income producing securities and Canadian equities.

The Fund will invest in Canadian preferred securities, with a focus on floating rate preferred securities; dividend paying Canadian equities; income and royalty trusts; ETFs; and fixed-income investments, with a view to consistent interest or distribution payments. Investments in floating rate preferred securities will be of Canadian issuers whose debt, at a minimum, has an investment grade rating at the time of purchase.

The Portfolio Advisor uses a top-down and bottom-up investment process, focusing on the risk return relationship of individual securities within a diversified portfolio. The process includes a macroeconomic forecast for the respective global and local economies, establishing investment themes and industries to overweight or underweight based on the Portfolio Advisor's outlook for a particular sector, view of current market trends and phase of the economic cycle. Fundamental research is used to select securities believed to offer attractive risk-adjusted returns based on the Portfolio Advisor's view of a company's growth prospects.

However, the Investment Advisor will be watchful for signs of weakening domestic data, as well as further weakening trends outside the US. As such, the Investment Advisor acknowledges the possible need to adjust our outlook and the Fund's subsequent positioning.

RISK

The Canadian preferred shares asset class, overall, contributed a muted performance over the first half of 2018, with preferred shares entrenched in a consolidating pattern following strong 2017 performance. Despite these patterns, the Fund was able to return a positive performance from January 1 through June 30, beating the S&P/TSX Preferred Share Index which returned negative performance over the same period. At one point the Fund was up 2% but moved closer in line with the S&P/TSX Preferred Share Index with the swoon in the Government of Canada 5-year yield when rate-resets occurred.

Rate-reset preferreds have periodic resets of coupon rates commensurate with changes in bond yields, which allows them to benefit from higher government bond yields rise. Thus, the Fund's rate-reset positions contributed positively to returns in the rising interest rate environment.

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RECENT DEVELOPMENTS

The Redwood Canadian Preferred Share Fund switched names to Purpose Canadian Preferred Share Fund in early May. The Portfolio Manager was also changed and is now managed by Sandy Liang. He has over 25 years of experience managing credit investments, and believes in thinking like a lender, and will deploying the Fund's strategy as such.

The Manager continues to favour the preferred share asset class because of the relative value compared with straight debt of high-grade debt issuers, especially considering the favourable tax treatment of preferred equity.

The Fund continues to slowly trim some higher-beta positions that don't meet credit risk/reward standards and issuer families to take a more defensive position. The Manager continues to focus on credit quality and risk management, maintaining his belief that there is opportunity in preferreds as they have lagged behind the move upward in bond yields witnessed since the beginning of 2018.

The members of the Independent Review Committee as at December 31, 2017 were Douglas G. Hall (Chair), Randall C. Barnes, and Michael Hollend. On February 5, 2018 Michael Hollend ceased being a member of the Independent Review Committee. The vacant position was filled by Jean M. Fraser on May 18, 2018.

RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

Purpose is deemed to be a related party as Manager of the Fund. Please refer below to the "Management Fee" section for fees paid to Purpose. Purpose has also appointed an Independent Review Committee ("IRC") as required by National Instrument 81-107 *Independent Review Committee for Investment Funds*. The mandate of the IRC is to review, and provide input on, the Manager's written policies and procedures that deal with conflict of interest matters in respect of the Funds. IRC members receive fees and reimbursement of expenses for services provided to the Fund and other Purpose managed funds and such costs are allocated among all the Funds on a fair and reasonable basis. The fees for services rendered to the Funds are reported in the Statements of Comprehensive Income. There are no other related party transactions for the Fund

INDEPENDENT REVIEW COMMITTEE

The Manager is required to comply with the policies and procedures presented to the IRC with respect to various potential conflicts of interest including valuation and the allocation of operating expenses and to provide periodic reports to the IRC in accordance with NI 81-107.

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MANAGEMENT FEES

Purpose manages and administers the business, operations and affairs of the Fund. As compensation for the services it provides to the Fund, Purpose is entitled to receive an annual management fee in an amount equal to 0.75% of the ETF units, 1.50% of NAV of the Class A units, 0.75% of the Class F units. The management fees are calculated daily and paid monthly in arrears. Purpose utilizes the management fees to pay investment sub-advisory fees, service fees to registered dealers of Class A, general and administrative expenses and earn revenue.

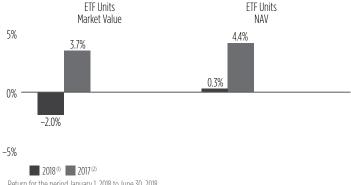

PAST PERFORMANCE

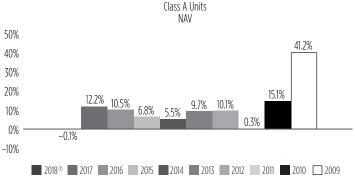

YEAR-BY-YEAR RETURNS

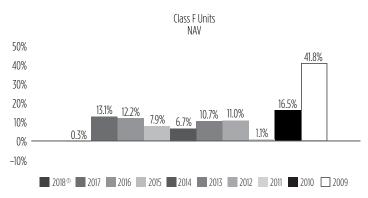
The bar charts show the performance of each class of units for the financial period in percentage terms, indicating how much an investment made on the first day of the period would have grown or decreased by the last day of the period.
